Covid Update

Although, understandably, Covid has not been so prominent in the news, the Office for National Statistics (ONS) reported that 1 in 16 people in England were infected with Covid last week.

The government has removed almost all legal restrictions, preferring people to take personal responsibility.

Care home residents, **people aged 75 and over** and those with a weakened immune system aged 12 and over **will be invited to get a spring COVID-19 booster**. The NHS will contact you and invite you to book your spring booster when it's due.

Although you are not legally required to self-isolate **if you test positive for COVID-19, you are advised to stay at home** if you can and avoid contact with other people.

You do not have to take daily tests or be legally required to self-isolate following contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.

The current dominant variant of Covid (Omicron BA.2) appears generally to cause less severe illness and also, with improved treatments, a smaller proportion of people are becoming seriously ill.

The situation locally: In South Lakeland, there were 798 confirmed cases of Covid-19 in the week to 11th March increasing to 1113 in the week to 18th March (an increase of 39%). In Cumbria as a whole the figures increased from 3329 to 4937 (by 48%). Although Infections rates among over 70s in Cumbria remain lower than other age groups, it is increasing rapidly (by about 50% in the last week). The Chart below shows cases in Cumbria by age group in the last two weeks.

To reduce the risk of Covid-19 circulating among Gatesbield staff and tenants, we intend to maintain the following measures (at least while case rates are so high):

- 1. Urge all those eligible to take up the offer of the 'Spring Booster' vaccine when offered.
- 2. Ask all staff to take a Lateral Flow Test regularly (preferably before arrival at Gatesbield).
- 3. Ask all visitors (i.e. people not resident at Gatesbield) coming to the communal areas (e.g. for lunch or other reasons) to take a lateral flow test.
- 4. Continue to encourage (and facilitate) all tenants to take lateral flow tests regularly.
- 5. Encourage tenants to ask their visitors (i.e. people not resident at Gatesbield) coming to their flats to take a lateral flow test ahead of the visit.

Gatesbield holds a modest stock of Lateral Flow Tests which are available for tenants and staff.
