

Further step on the Government's 'roadmap' out of lockdown

What has changed?


STEP 3—From Monday 17th May

Some big changes come into effect on 17th May. Up to 6 people (or two households if that is more than 6 people) can meet indoors and up to 30 people can meet outdoors. All bars, cafes and restaurants can serve indoors (but you must follow various rules when doing so) and all types of accommodation can open and overnight stays are now permitted in other people's homes.

Individuals are expected to take responsibility for whether to maintain social distancing with friends and family, but the government urges caution. You should always continue to maintain social distancing from anyone other than your friends or family.





At Gatesbield, the main changes are that you may visit other tenants (with their agreement) in their flats and we can re-open the Common Room and Craft Room, subject to restrictions—you must still observe social distancing in the communal areas of Gatesbield.

Remember—it remains much safer to meet others outdoors, but, if you do meet indoors, be sure to open a window to provide fresh air.
